DH499 - Digital Humanities Independent Study Fall 2022

"Challenges and Opportunities of Digital Archives" 3 credit hours

Independent Study Goals:

- 1. Learn how historians and educators are creating and using digital archives to reach and engage scholars, educators, and the general public.
- 2. Contribute to the creation of the Thirty Years of Mercy Digital Archive, chronicling the three decades of ministry and service by the <u>House of Mercy</u> (Belmont, NC)
- 3. Gain familiarity with <a>Omeka S, a digital archive platform commonly used in digital heritage projects.
- 4. Engage on the moral, ethical, and legal issues involved in creating an online archive.

Major Project Tasks:

- Gain familiarity with Omeka S through training exercises
- After training with project workflows, student will post, organize, and log digitized data into the Omeka S digital archive.
- Weekly communications with faculty and project team to assess progress, address challenges, and discuss assigned readings

Responsibilities:

- To provide timely communication in response to instructor outreach, and meet weekly or as needed with instructor
- In managing and uploading data, students will be responsible for maintaining the ethical, moral, and legal guidelines laid out at the beginning of the independent study
- Based on the schedule over which this independent study is completed, the student is expected to complete the following hours of work for the course:
